21c Museum Hotel Lexington is housed in the Fayette National Bank Building, located in the Downtown Lexington Historic District. The 15-story building was originally designed by architects McKim, Mead and White, famous for the American Academy in Rome and parts of the Metropolitan Museum of Art. The 21c design team, led by New York-based architects Deborah Berke Partners, has embraced the building's original features to create a space where contemporary and historic meet and contrast. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, many of the Beaux Arts International-inspired building's historic features have been preserved and restored including Ionic Order exterior columns, marbled walls, Tennessee Pink marble flooring and vaulted ceilings with ornamental plaster patterns.
